The event is free but places are limited so attendance needs to be booked with the library





## **Sculpture Tour**

Each month throughout the summer the University of Hertfordshire have organised Sculpture Tours at the University's College Lane Campus. "The tour provides local audiences the opportunity to engage and discover contemporary art sculpture." Led by Amisha Karia, Collections and Exhibitions Organiser, the visitor is shown eight different sculptures that take us from the 1950's when the College Lane Campus was built to the present day.

Two of the older sculptures are on the original Main Building.

The first is by Trevor Tennant, (born 2 July 1900) who was a sculptor, painter and teacher. He was commissioned by Hertfordshire County Council in 1948 to produce a wall sculpture for Hatfield Technical College that responded to the architect's plans of the Main Building, which opened in 1952. One of the more modern sculptures is by Diane Maclean, a sculptor and environmental artist and is an alumni of the University of Hertfordshire. 'Mountain', a stainless steel walk-through sculpture was displayed at the Natural History Museum in 2005 before moving to its permanent home at the university.

The second is by Barbara Hepworth (10 January 1903 – 20 May 1975) who was an English sculptor. Her work exemplifies Modernism and with such contemporaries as Ivon Hitchens, Henry Moore, Ben Nicholson, Naum Gabo she helped to develop modern art (sculpture in particular) in Britain.
