We are trying to find out the names of three of the six ringers in the 'George Austin' photo attached. The photo was found amongst George Austin's possessions after he died in February 2013. From left we know Stan Huckle (far left); the two to the left of him we don't know, then George Austin and Eric Edmonson and we don't know the chap on the right. On the back of the photo is written 'Kimpton, 1964'. George rang the bells at Hatfield for more than 50 years and we think these are all Hatfield ringers (Eric and Stan were certainly ringers at Hatfield). Stan and George both used to work at De Havilland. Eric was an architect.
